Homeless Outreach and Engagement Program
Insight Housing Narrative Report to City Council
October 1st – December 31st, 2024

The Albany Project Hope team has made progress this quarter in outreach and housing navigation efforts, supporting individuals experiencing housing instability in Albany. Our commitment to connecting unsheltered clients with essential resources, improving housing retention, and fostering collaboration with community partners has been at the forefront of our mission.

Activities this quarter include:

Outreach Efforts:

Our case managers successfully reached out to 17 unsheltered clients and enrolled 5 of them under outreach in HMIS. We conducted outreach over 60 days at Albany CARES Drop-In Hours, engaging with community members daily to raise awareness about available resources and services. Despite the challenging environment, we were unable to provide short-term motel stays this quarter, highlighting the ongoing gap in bridging access from temporary to permanent housing options.

Housing Navigation Services:

Housing navigation has been critical in assisting clients toward stability. This quarter, we completed 1 Coordinated Entry System (CES) assessments to identify housing needs and eligibility for various programs and developed 2 tailored housing stability plans to address unique client circumstances. Our team facilitated 4 housing searches, helping clients locate suitable and affordable options. Through targeted stabilization strategies, we successfully supported 2 households in maintaining their residences. Additionally, the team conducted 18 home visits to provide direct support and assess living conditions, ensuring participants received the assistance they needed.

2 clients were provided with funds for move-in costs this quarter. We also assisted 3 clients in obtaining essential household items, 1 for the master-leased home in Oakland and 2 in our RRH program, which will support their transitions into stable housing.

Support for Landlords:

We provided ongoing support to 2 landlords, fostering positive relationships that enhance their participation in housing stability efforts. This included educating landlord on tenant needs, maintaining properties and willingness to collaborate with the Albany program. Timely completion of Temporary Financial Assistance forms ensured that payments to the landlords were made promptly, contributing to a supportive housing environment.

Referrals and Linkages:

We successfully connected participants to **three** external service providers, ensuring access to crucial resources such as mental health and medical support, and increasing income. This coordination with providers like Lifelong Medical, Berkeley Mental Health, Cal-Pep and Alameda County Social Services in downtown Oakland which have led to improved outcomes for participants, demonstrating the importance of partnership in achieving lasting change.

Transportation Services:

Transportation support was essential this quarter, with the case manager assisting clients **105** times in securing and maintaining permanent housing. This included transporting clients to view new units, grocery stores, medical appointments, and helping them obtain money orders and other payment vouchers for rent and shelter.

Service Tracking:

Our data tracking reflects **98** total interactions with clients this quarter, showcasing a diverse range of needs and the effectiveness of our interventions.

Conclusion:

The Project Hope Program continues to make significant strides in supporting individuals facing housing instability in Albany. Through dedicated outreach, housing navigation, and collaboration with community partners, we aim to foster lasting change in the community.

Goals for next quarter

To further strengthen our impact, we plan to:

- Fill all rooms in both houses with participants
- Expand partnerships with additional service providers.
- Enhance outreach efforts with supplies and incentives for participation in the program.
- Increase outreach efforts along with housing navigation enrollments.

By focusing on these areas, we hope to continue making a meaningful difference in the lives of those we serve.

Success

This quarter, we have been working with a client who has been staying in her car alongside her young son for over 2 years. Our case manager was able to help her increase her income, find a landlord willing to rent to her and move her into her own 1-bedroom apartment just in time for the holidays. We were able to provide move-in supplies and furniture to help them build their new home.

Now, the client is working full-time, her son is excelling in school and actively engaging with the case manager, marking a significant step forward given her previous reluctance to accept help. This

transformation not only highlights the effectiveness of the program but also illustrates the power of building trust and fostering collaboration in helping individuals overcome barriers to stability. Another success is having another case manager supporting our full-time case manager with outreach and housing navigation. She has been a vital part of this team, and her onboarding has largely contributed to the increase in outreach and interaction numbers.

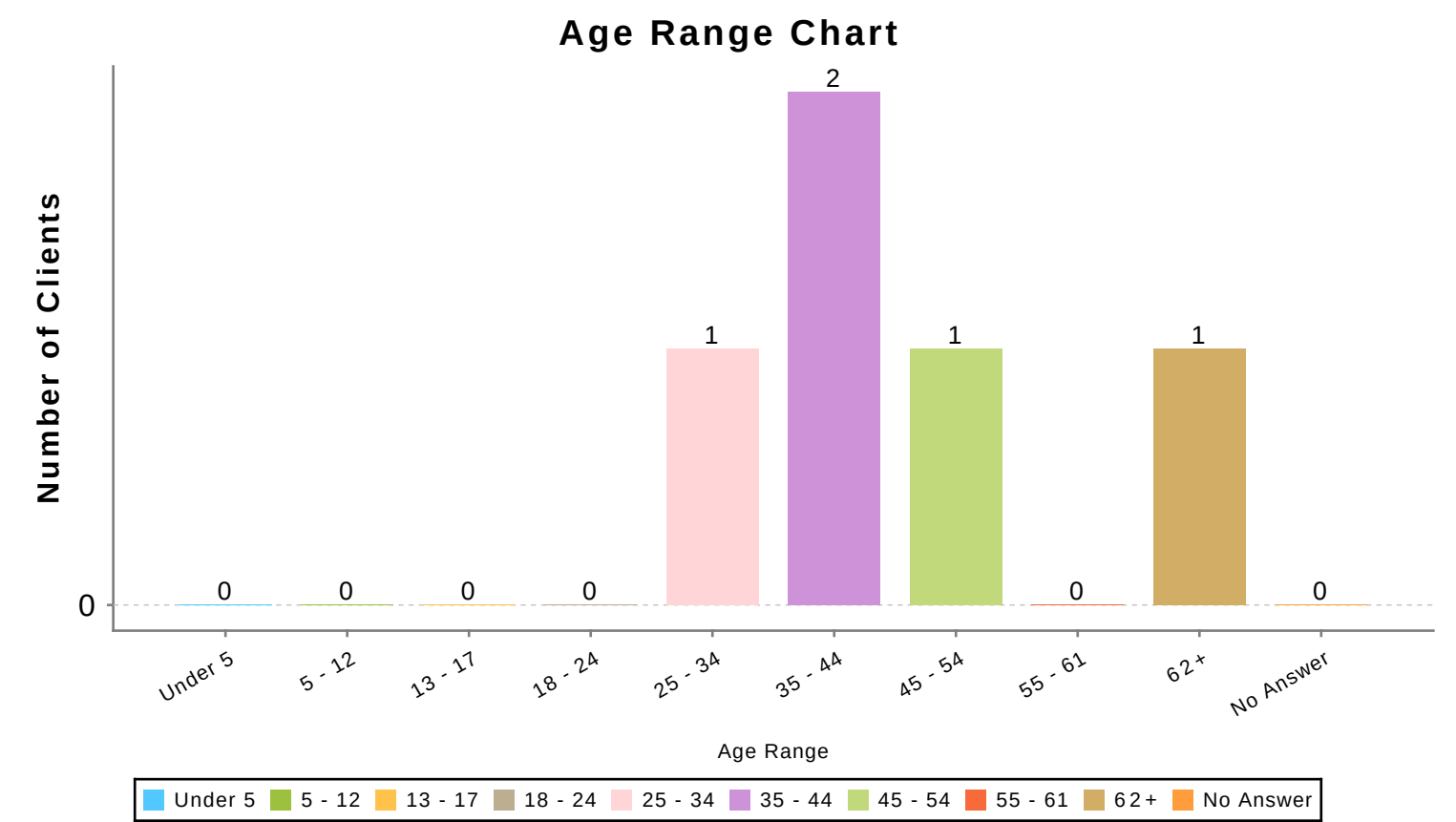
Challenges

Our challenges have included that some clients still refuse available shelter options, often preferring motel or solo rooms despite the lack of availability or sustainability long term. We think it would be beneficial to have consistent access to mental health assistance to help some clients successfully obtain and sustain permanent housing. Addressing these systemic issues remains critical for enhancing overall impact and better serving the community.

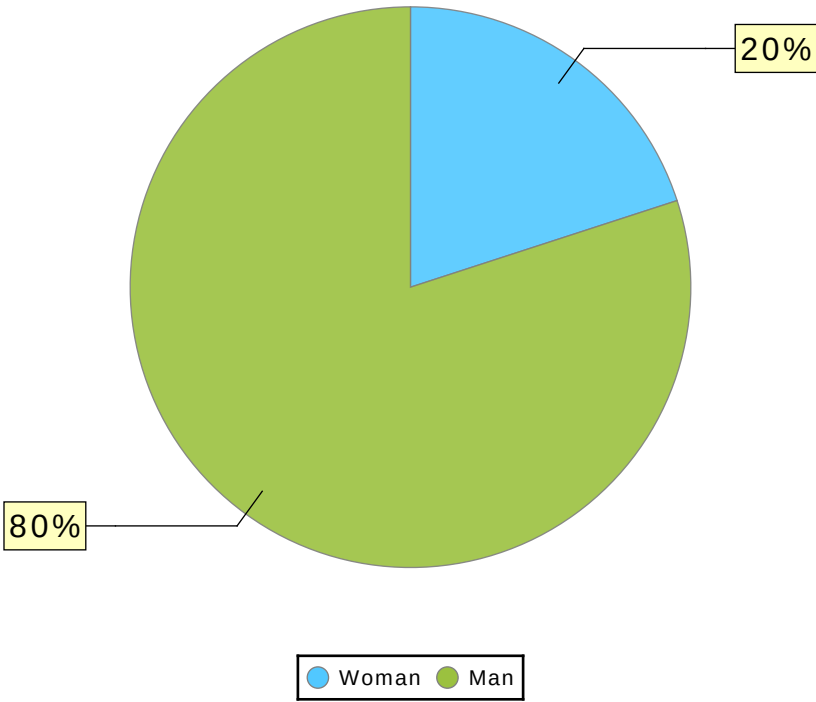

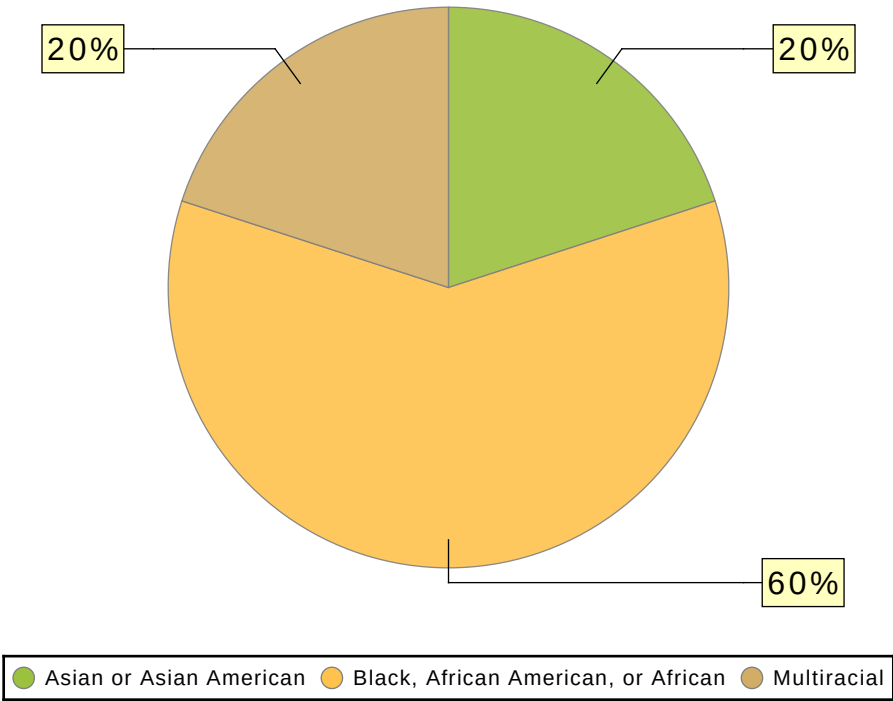

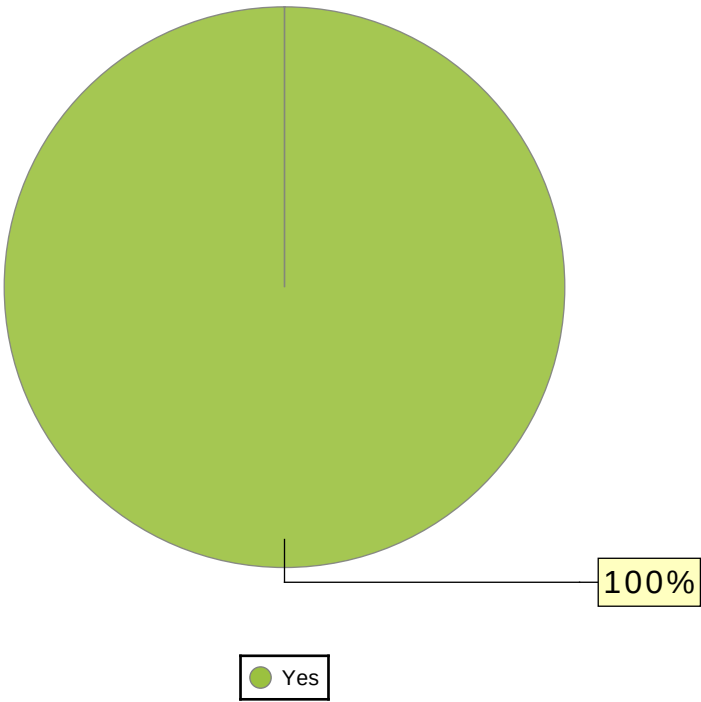

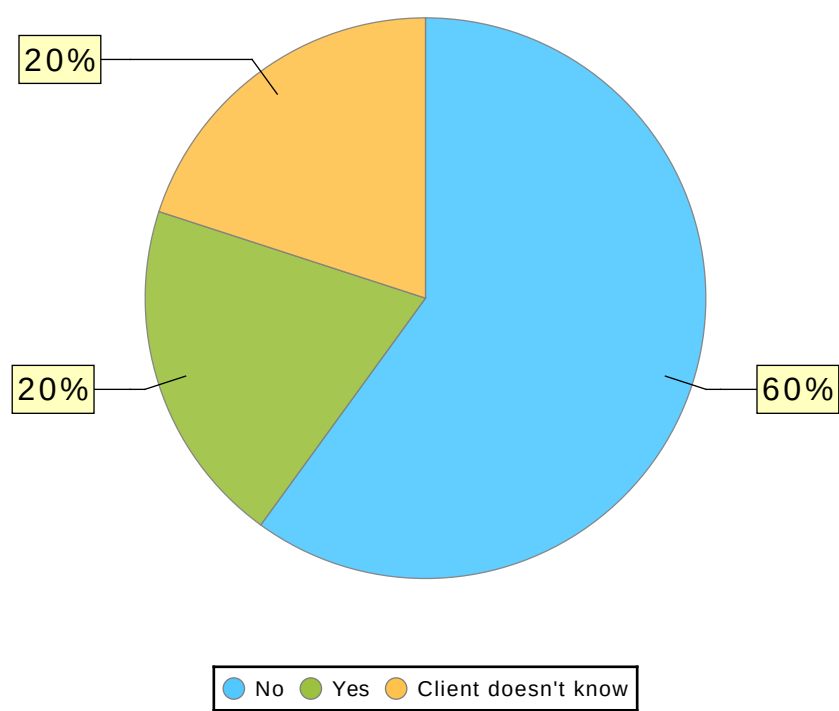

Physical Disability Chart



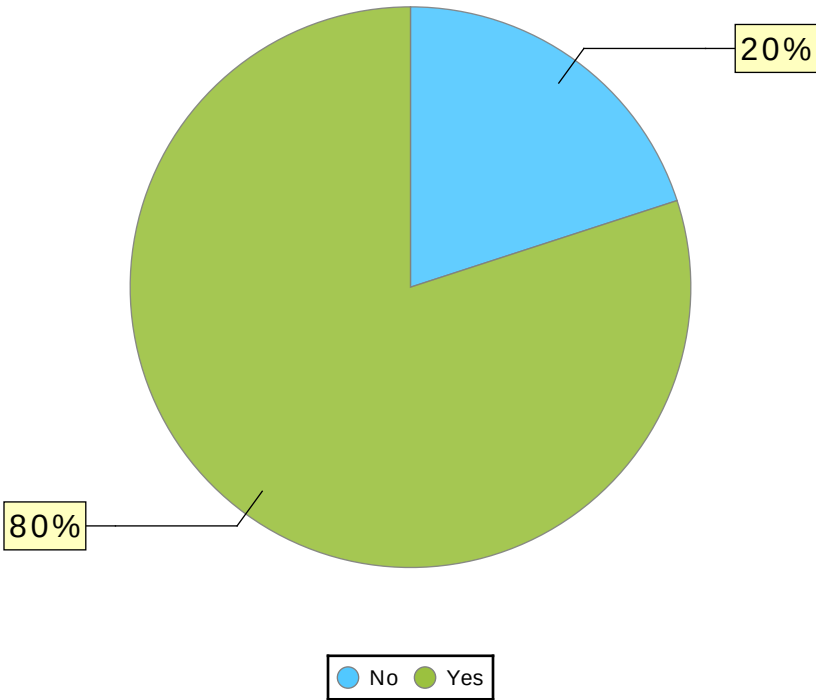

Developmental Disability Chart



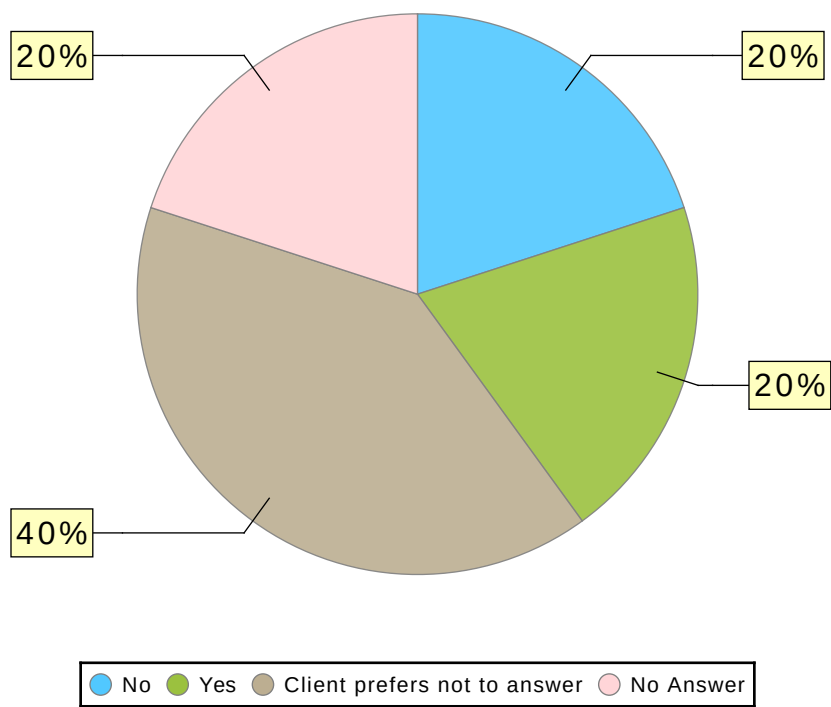

Chronic Health Condition Chart



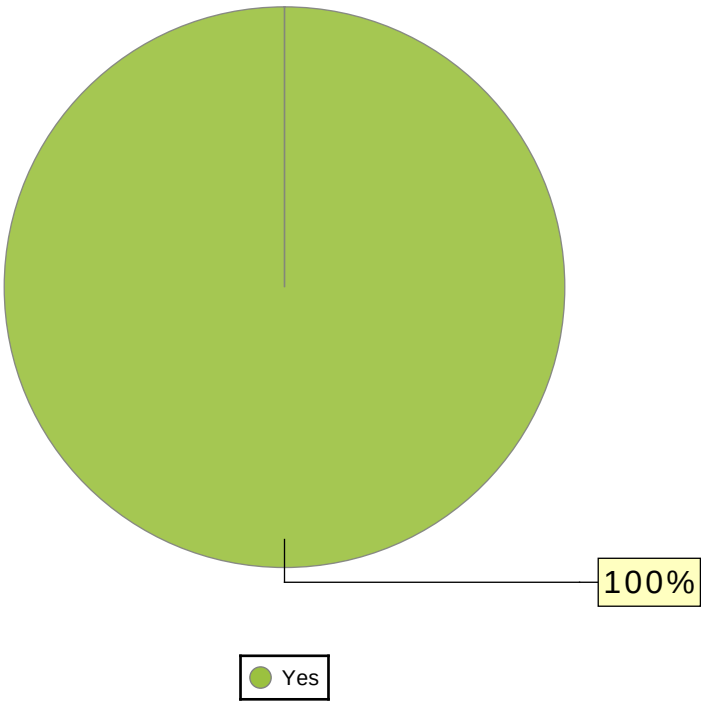

HIV/AIDS Chart



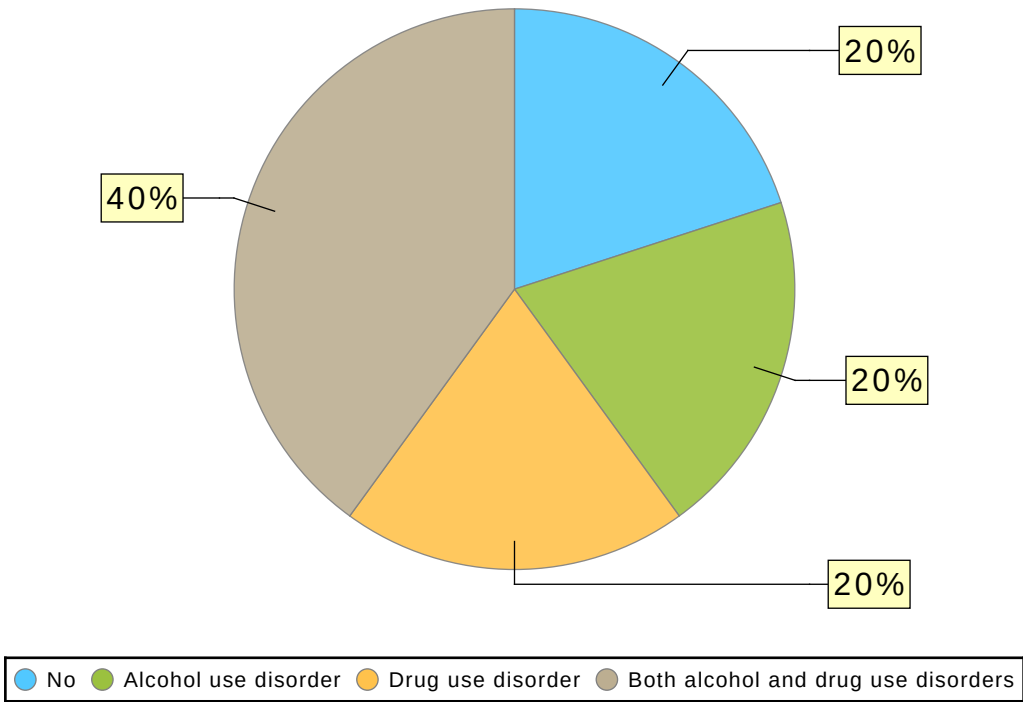

Mental Health Disorder Chart



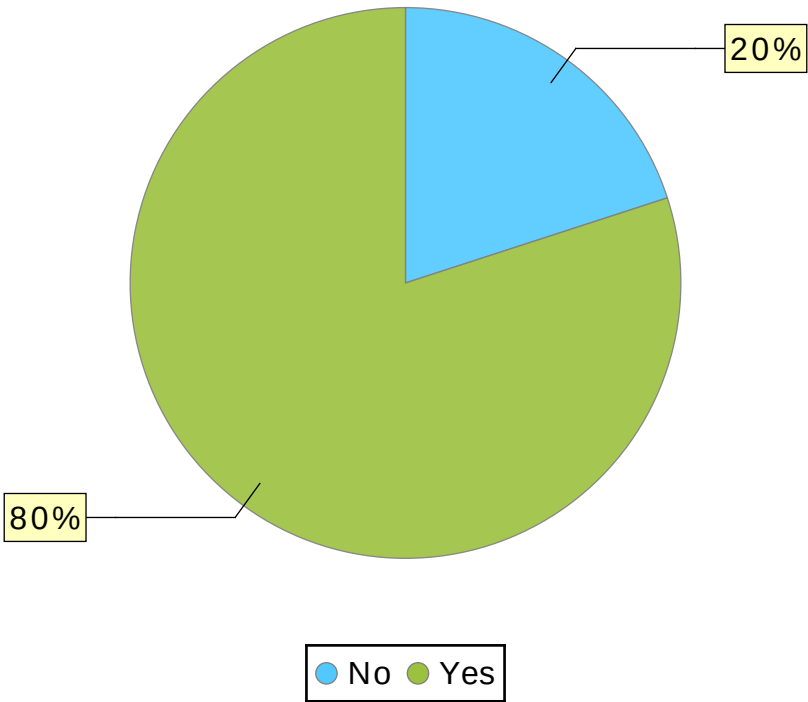

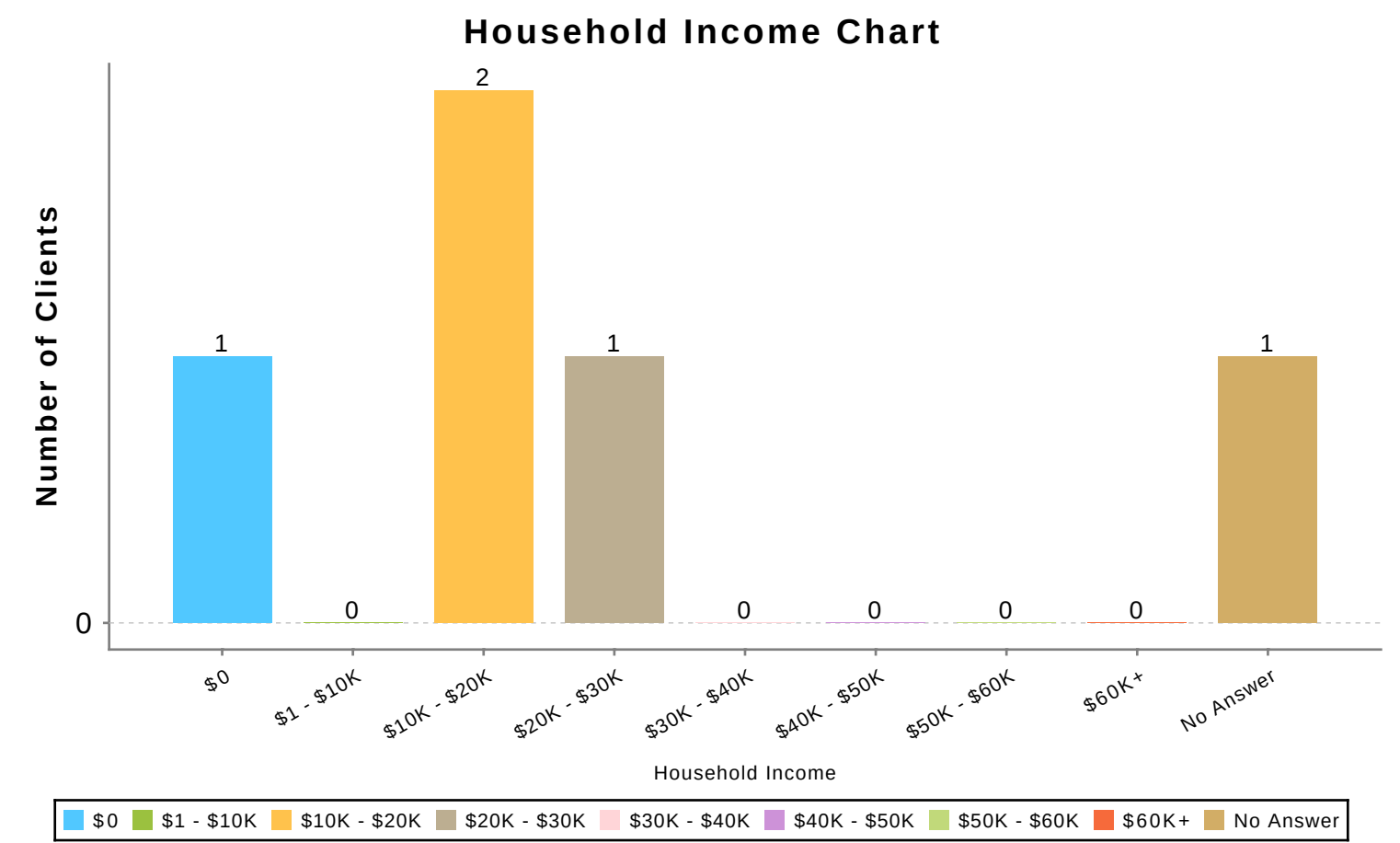

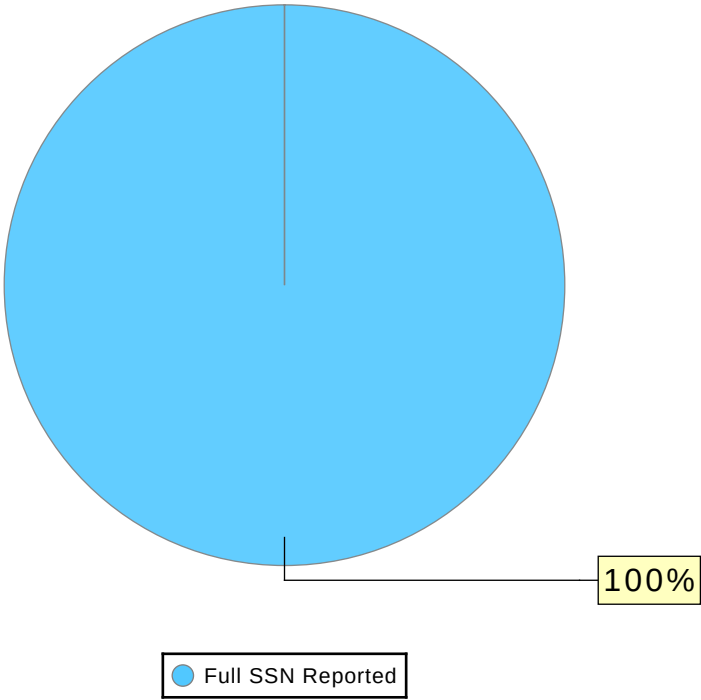

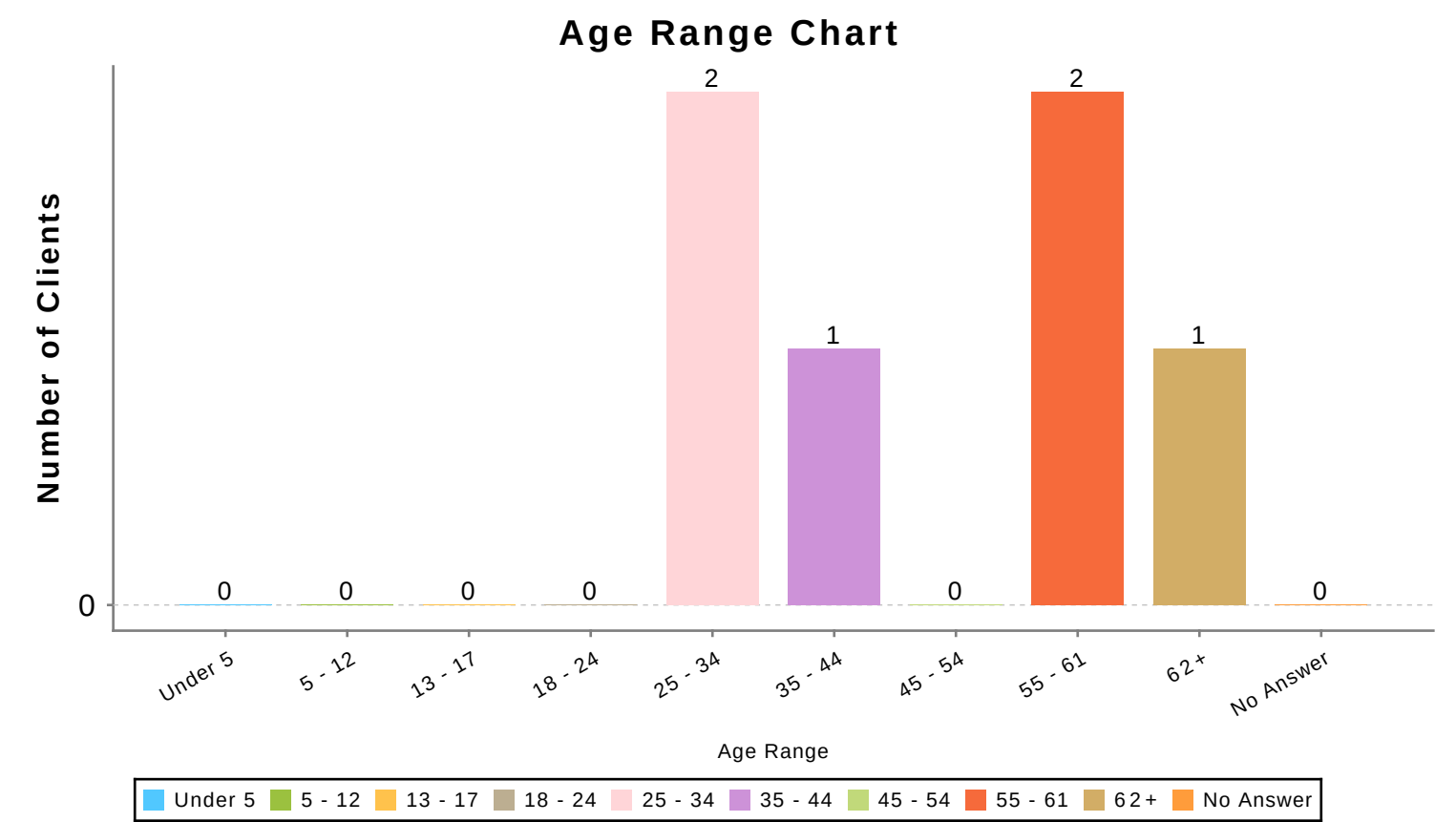

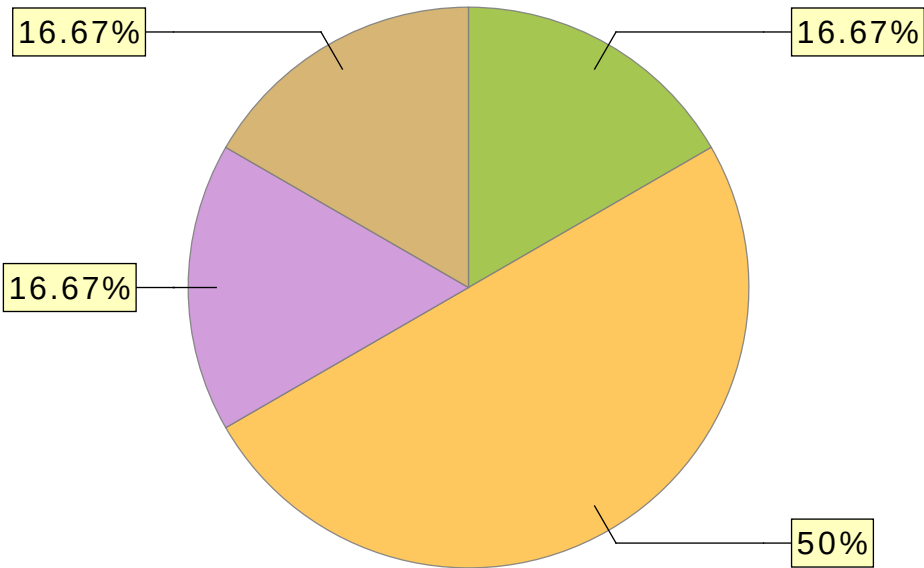

Physical Disability Chart



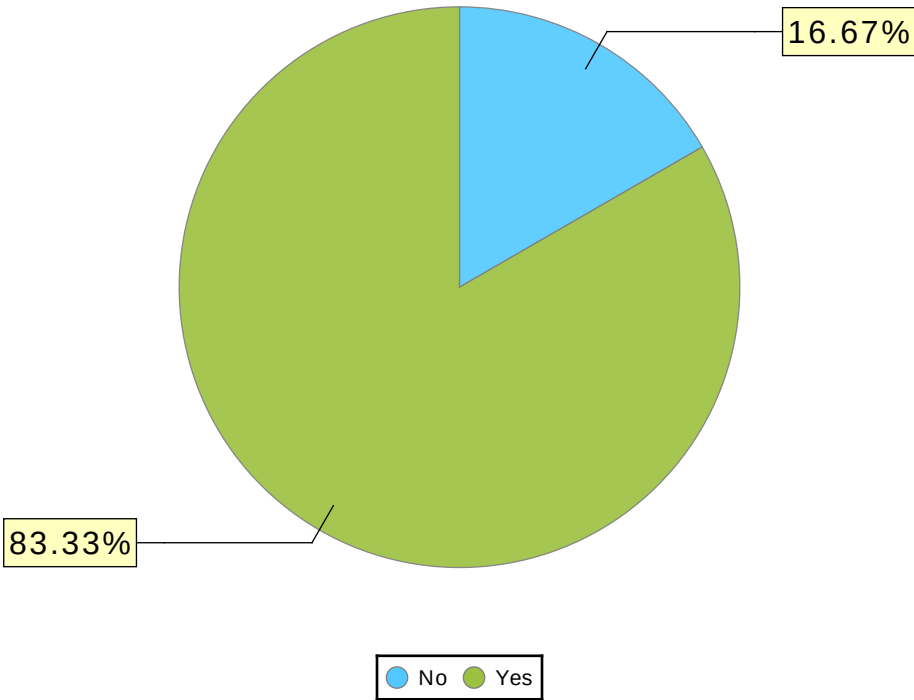

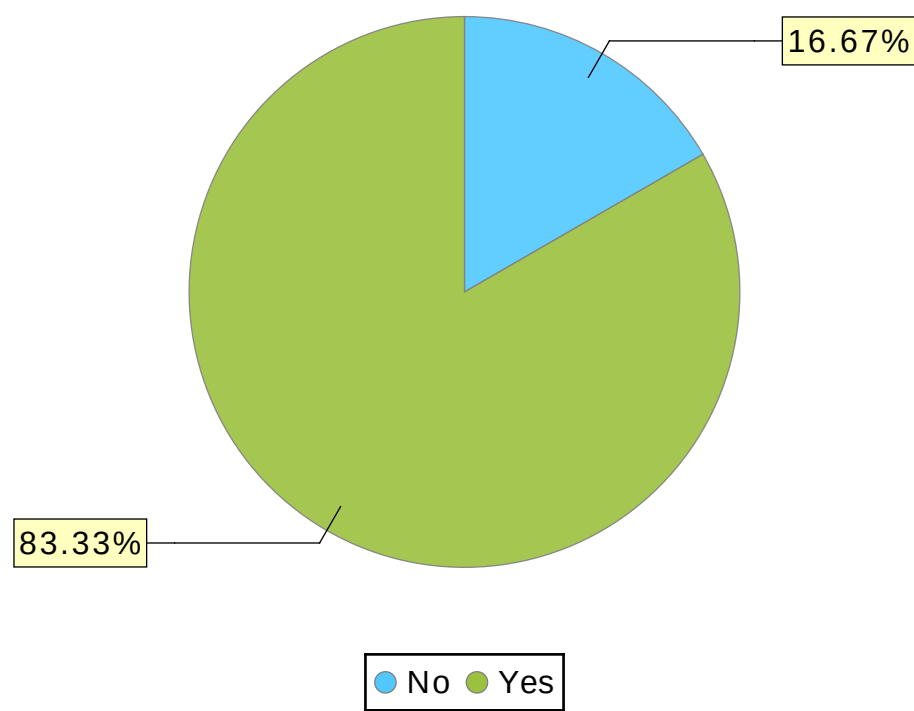

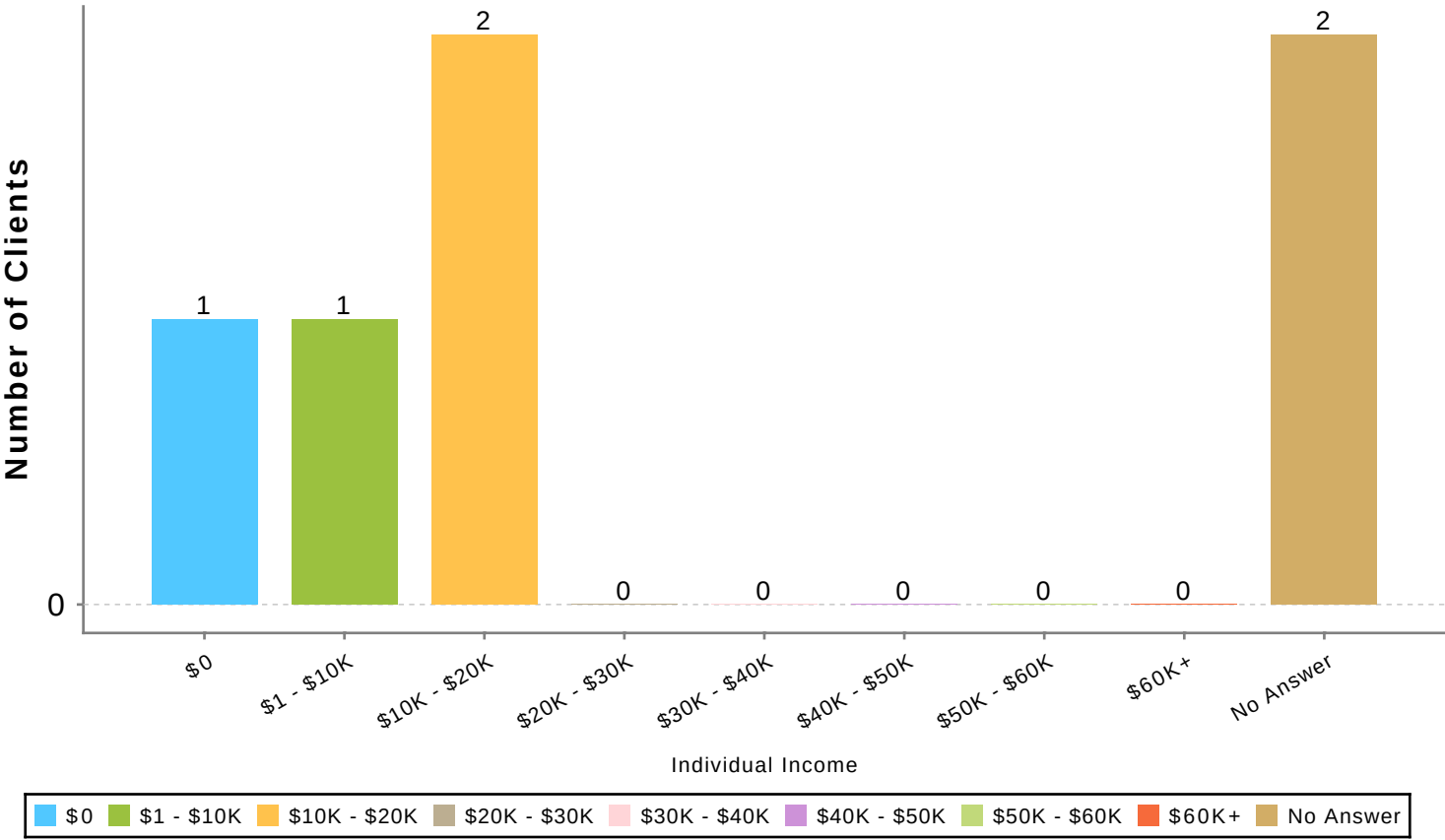

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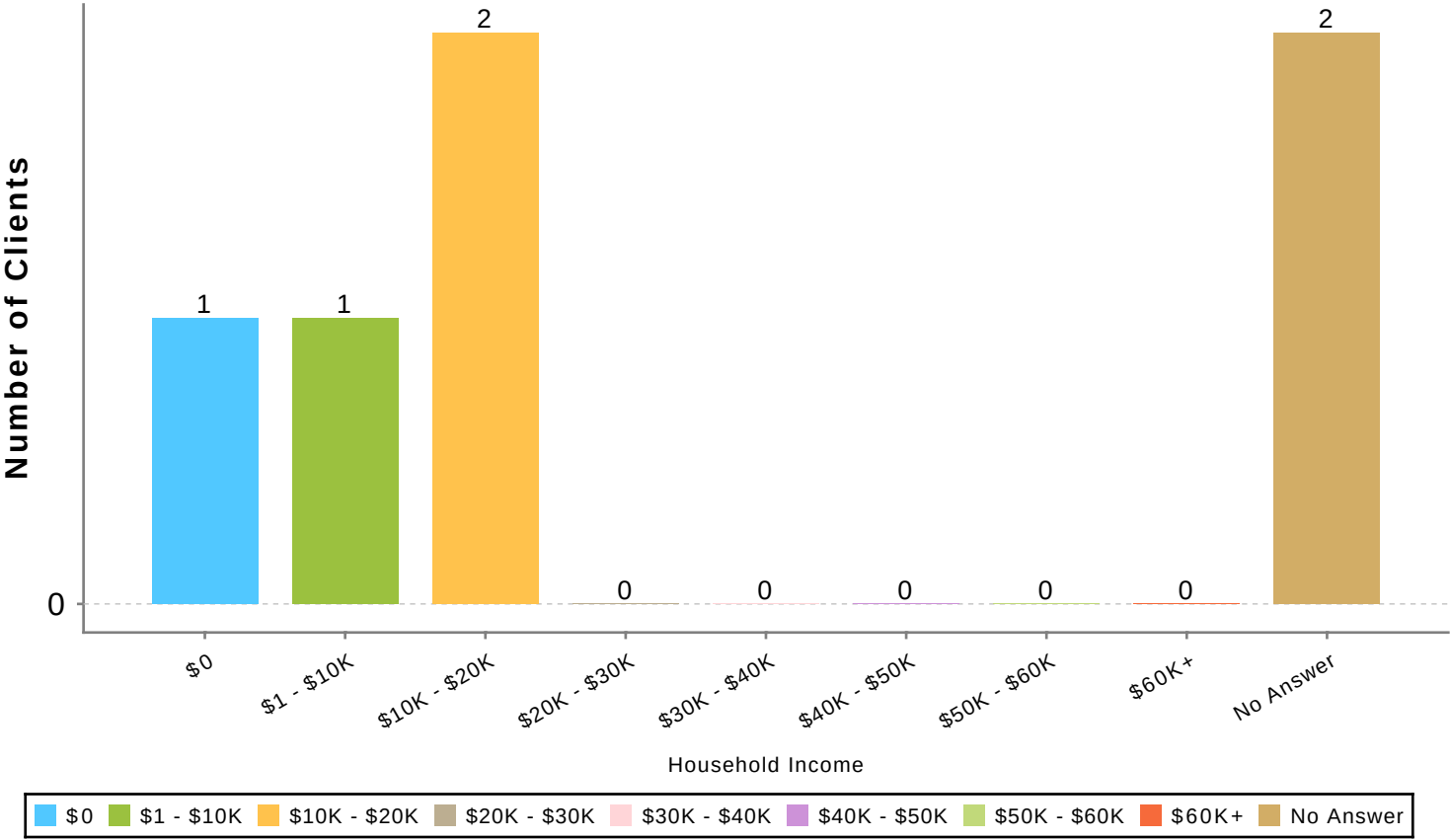

Individual Income (Adults & HoH) Chart



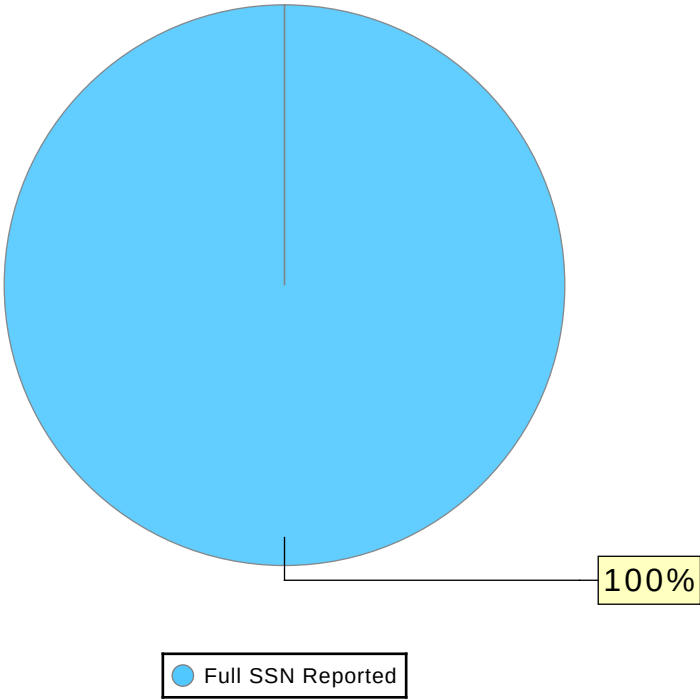
